Print version of the Report Presented to the ARIA Board August 2016

1. Submission and Publication Statistics.

The *Journal* continues to have a healthy flow of submissions, with 103 new submissions during the first six months of 2016, which compares favorably to the 192 new submissions received during the 2015 calendar year. In terms of backlog, the *Journal* currently has 73 articles that have been accepted for publication, but have not yet appeared in the print edition. Nine of these articles are scheduled to appear in the September 2016 issue of the *Journal*, leaving a net backlog of 64 accepted articles. The status of the accepted papers is described in the following table.

As noted in previous reports, due to a server failure in August 2012 the manuscripts submitted prior to January 1, 2013 were handled as paper files with correspondence by email. I am pleased to announce that, after three and one-half years, we have worked our way through these legacy manuscripts and now all submissions are on ScholarOne.

Since we implemented ScholarOne for new submissions in January of 2013, we have processed 660 new submissions, the disposition of which is described in the following table.

Finally, the *Journal* has, since the beginning of 2013, received new submissions from corresponding authors in 50 countries. Submissions from the United States accounted for 32.9% of this number, followed by Taiwan (9.1%), Germany (9.4%) and Canada (5.8%). A complete listing is contained in Appendix A.

2. Impact Assessment

The impact factor, produced by the Journal Citation Reports of the Institute for Scientific Information, is the most frequently used measure of journal quality. The 2015 two-year impact factor is calculated by dividing the number of citations in 2015 of articles published in the *JRI* in 2013 and 2014 by the total number of articles published in 2013 and 2014. The 2015 impact factor is 1.535, an increase from the corresponding 2014 impact factor of 1.075. The 2015 five-year impact factor is 1.747, an increase from the corresponding 2014 five-year impact factor of 1.385.

In terms of citation rankings, the *Journal* was in 2015 ranked 23/94 amongst business and finance journals (as compared to 39/88 in 2014), and 83/334 in economics journals (whereas the 2014 ranking was 130/333).

According to the *Wiley-Blackwell Publisher's Report 2015*, the number of full text downloads for the *JRI* from the Wiley Online Library and 3rd parties during 2015 has remained stable, as the chart from the *Report* below indicates.



This chart shows the increase in the number of downloads to *JRI* in the period 2002 to 2015. The total includes usage on Wiley Online Library, EBSCO and other third-party databases. Downloads remained stable in 2015 after an 8.5% increase in 2014. This compares with an increase of 1.8% across all Wiley Journals in Finance & Investments.

Currently, 1,269 individuals are registered to receive automatic content alerts, which is a 1.9% increase over 2014.

From July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016, there were 3048 page views and 527 full paper downloads from the IDEAS (RePEc) web site, down from 3055 and 661, respectively, in the previous 12 months.

All articles published in the *Journal* are automatically uploaded to the IDEAS website (located at http://ideas.repec.org/s/bla/jrinsu.html) as well as the EconPapers website (located at http://econpapers.repec.org/article/blajrinsu/).

3. Editorial Board.

While all of the legacy manuscripts were handled directly by the Editor, those submitted through ScholarOne are assigned either to the Editor, or to one of the six Co-Editors. Each of the Co-Editors has agreed to supervise 12-14 submissions per year, which for each paper entails the assignment of reviewers and the making of a recommendation to the Editor regarding disposition. The Co-Editors also manage any resubmissions of original manuscripts to which they were assigned.

During the past year, we have replaced two Co-Editors, as Harris Schlesinger passed away after a long struggle with health issues, and Richard Phillips had to step aside as he is now Dean of the Robinson College of Business at Georgia State University.

Currently, the six Co-Editors are Richard Butler (Brigham Young University), Christian Gollier (Toulouse School of Economics), Scott Harrington (University of Pennsylvania), Greg Niehaus (University of South Carolina), Arthur Snow (University of Georgia) and Mary Weiss (Temple University). All of these Co-Editors have been exemplary in the performance of their duties, which is greatly appreciated by the Editorial Office.

The distribution of assignments for manuscripts submitted through ScholarOne is presented in the following table.

David Cather remains the Book Review Editor. The current list of editors is contained in Appendix B.

4. Manuscript Referees.

The list of the 541 reviewers that have been used for the manuscripts handled by the Editorial Office since January 1, 2013 is contained in Appendix C. This list contains reviewers of both ScholarOne manuscripts and the legacy manuscripts that were handled by the Editorial Office.

5. Submission Development.

The *Symposium on the Methodologies of Behavioral Insurance*, which was produced by guest editors Andreas Richter (Ludwig-Maximilians-Universitat Munich) and Glenn Harrison (Georgia State University), appeared in the March 2016 issue of the Journal.

There are three other special issues in progress. The first is *Longevity 10—The Tenth International Longevity Risk and Capital Markets Solutions Conference* and the guest editors of this special issue are David Blake (City University of London) and Marco Morales (Universidad Diego Portales). This will appear as extra (fifth) issue of the *Journal* during the Spring of 2017. As noted in a previous report, the estimate from Wiley-Blackwell is that the cost of a one-time fifth issue would be approximately \$8182, and the guest editors have committed to cover \$5000 of this amount; the Board agreed to cover the remaining balance.

The second special issue will be entitled *Risk in Emerging Markets* and will feature papers drawn from the *Insurance Risk and Finance Research Conference* held at the Nanyang Technical University on June 25-26, 2015. The guest editors are David Cummins (Temple University) and Michael Powers (Tsinghua University), and this issue is expected to appear in 2018.

The third special issue is tentatively entitled *Choices Under Uncertainty Beyond Risk Aversion* and will be directed toward topics that are closely associated with our recently departed colleague, Harris Schlesinger. Christian Gollier (Toulouse School of Economics) and Louis Eeckhoudt (Catholic University of Mons) have agreed to serve as guest editors.

6. Mehr Award.

The Editorial Board is responsible for the selection of the Mehr Award recipient. Each year ARIA presents the Robert I. Mehr Award to the author(s) of the *JRI* article

"that has best stood the test of time". Since the articles must be at least ten years old, those papers appearing in 2006 were considered.

All the Co-editors and the Associate Editors that do not have an article in the volume under consideration are eligible to vote. On April 11, 2016 the Assistant Editor sent to all members of the selection committee a list of articles to be considered from volume 73 of the *Journal*, including the abstract, citation information, and a web link to the article in JSTOR. Each of the editors was asked to rank their top three choices. When the rankings were received in the Editorial Office, the Assistant Editor assigned each first choice 3 points, the second choices 2 points, and the third choices were given 1 point. A score was calculated for each candidate article. If there were no clear majority on the first ballot, a second ballot would have been held.

This year there was a clear majority on the first ballot. The selection committee recommended that the 2016 Robert I. Mehr Award be given to Andrew J. G. Cairnes, David Blake, and Kevin Dowd for their article entitled "A Two-Factor Model for Stochastic Mortality with Parameter Uncertainty: Theory and Calibration" (Volume 73, Number 4, December 2006).

7. Open Access and Supporting Information.

There are two important changes to the Journal that have been recently implemented.

The first is Open Access. While in the past, authors of papers accepted for publication were required to transfer the copyright to Wiley-Blackwell, OnlineOpen is now available to authors who wish to make their article available to non-subscribers on publication, or whose funding agency requires grantees to archive the final version of their article. This requires a fee of US\$3000 to be paid by the author, the author's funding agency, or the author's institution. Details are provided on the Wiley *IRI* web pages at

Open access articles will be subject to the same refereeing and editorial processes as any other article. Moreover, open access articles will not displace regular articles in the *Journal* as the fees are used to cover, among other things, the cost of increasing the number of pages to accommodate the open access articles.

The second change is that the Wiley Online Library web pages for the *Journal* will now have a Supporting Information section. This will appear as a link when readers view the article through the Online Library, and a citation link will be inserted during production into the article's references. This will permit the authors to put, for example, technical appendices or data in the Online Library so that it does not need to appear in the article and therefore should economize on journal page space

going forward. Our goal is to publish more, but shorter, articles in the *Journal* with the more esoteric details placed in the Supporting Information archive on the article's web page in the Online Library. Details can be found at

http://journalofriskandinsurance.smeal.psu.edu/submissions/supporting-information.

This strategy should eventually enable the reduction in the length of the queue of papers that have been accepted but not yet appeared in print.

8. ScholarOne, Wiley-Blackwell, and ARIA Administrative Staff.

The main contact with the publisher Wiley-Blackwell for matters involving the management of the *Journal* is now Matthew Cooper (mcooper@wiley.com) who is very accessible and extremely responsive. His assistance was instrumental in setting up the Open Access and the Supporting Information initiatives noted above. Our Production Editor is Lou Philippe P. Manila (lpmanila@wiley.com), who has been both efficient and easy to deal with. The ScholarOne web site continues to work flawlessly, and our (mostly minor) questions are now directed to their help desk, which has been very effective.

After the papers are accepted for publication by the Editorial Office, the process of contacting the authors for proofreading and the preparation of the manuscript for publication is handled entirely by Wiley-Blackwell. Once a manuscript is ready to be displayed on Early View, the Editor is contacted to examine the last draft. After editorial approval, the manuscript is posted on-line in publication format and may be viewed through Early View at

http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/journal/10.1111/(ISSN)1539-6975/earlyview.

Articles formally scheduled to appear in a print issue are also displayed in the Wiley Online Library prior to the print issue publication.

The primary contacts with ARIA are Tony Biacchi and Jennifer Long. We have an excellent relationship with both.

Finally, a special recognition and thanks is due our Managing Assistant Editor, Lisa Ford, whose tireless dedication to the Journal is the reason that the Editorial Office operates so efficiently.
